

STUDENTS' BILL of RIGHTS

Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Stalking, Sexual Assault, Sexual Harassment and Gender Discrimination

All Students have the right to:

- 1. Make a report to local law enforcement and/or state police.
- Have disclosures of domestic violence, dating violence, stalking and sexual assault treated seriously.
- Make a decision about whether or not to disclose a crime or violation and participate in the judicial or conduct process and/or criminal justice process free from pressure by the University.
- Participate in a process that is fair, impartial, and provides adequate notice and a meaningful opportunity to be heard.
- Be treated with dignity and to receive from the University courteous, fair, and respectful health care and counseling services, as available through Health Services and Student Personal Counseling.
- Be free from any suggestion that the reporting individual is at fault when these crimes and violations are committed, or should have acted in a different manner to avoid such crimes or violations.
- Describe the incident to as few University representatives as practicable and not be required to unnecessarily repeat a description of the incident.
- Be protected from retaliation by the University, any student, the accused and/or the respondent, and/or their friends, family and acquaintances within the University's jurisdiction.
- 9. Access to at least one level of appeal of a determination.
- Be accompanied by an advisor of choice who may assist and advise a reporting individual, accused, or respondent throughout the judicial or conduct process including during all meetings and hearings related to such process.
- Exercise civil rights and practice of religion without interference by the investigative, criminal justice, or judicial or conduct process of the University.

If you have experienced Sexual Harassment, Sexual Assault, Partner Abuse or Stalking, you have options.

Do you want to tell someone?

Would you like to speak to someone **confidentially?** This means the information disclosed will remain with you and the confidential source. The confidential source *is not obligated to report* to the Title IX coordinator or anyone else (with a few safety exceptions). **Molloy's confidential resources** include: Student Personal Counseling Center (Public Square 030) and Health Services (Wilbur 103B).

VES: Would you like to speak to someone **privately**? This means the person you are sharing the information with is obligated to report known names and facts to the Title IX coordinator, but privacy will be maintained to the greatest extent possible. Molloy's private resources include Public Safety, Student Affairs staff, Residence Life staff, Campus Ministries staff, Title IX coordinators, athletic coaches, and any Molloy University faculty or staff member.

NO: The choice is up to you, and you can always change your mind later!

Do you want to access resources for help & support? ES: Support can include academic flexibility, psychological counseling, and other accommodations based on your unique circumstances, and you will not be required to make a report.

On-campus resources include: The Student Personal Counseling Center (Public Square 030), Title IX Office (Kellenberg 011), Health Services (Wilbur 103B).

Off-campus resources include: The Safe Center Long Island, local hospitals, National Domestic Violence Hotline, RAINN National Sexual Assault Hotline, RISE (you can find their contact information on the attached resources page).

NO: That is okay! You do not have to, though we do encourage you to get support. Keep in mind, resources and support are always available to you.

Do you want to make a report? Reporting could include filing a complaint under Title IX grievance procedures, reporting to the police, or both. You can make a report to the Title IX Office at any time by phone, mail, email, or in person. Anonymous complaints can also be made online at: https://secure.ethicspoint.com/domain/media/en/gui/49117/index.html.

NO: This is your decision to make. If you feel differently about it down the line, that is okay too. There is no deadline for reporting, and you can always utilize the resources available to you.

NOT SURE: That's okay! You can talk to Molloy's Title IX coordinator about what your reporting options are without disclosing all or any details.
