- You are registered to take the class(es) through Molloy University in 2023.
- You can show proof that you qualify for assistance programs such as Medicaid, SNAP, work study, Pell or TAP grants, or free/reduced school lunch (household income).

Rolling deadline. Please submit application at least 3 weeks prior to the course start date. You will receive a response within 7 business days after the application is received. Scholarships may pay for the entire courseload in 2023, up to \$10,000.

Courses are offered throughout the year on day, evening, and weekend schedules. Some courses are held online through Zoom and others are in person. Classes may be held on Molloy's main campus in Rockville Centre; satellite center at 30 Hempstead, Rockville Centre; or Suffolk Center campus in Amityville.
