Course Description:

What does it take to be successful in Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math? By embedding lessons with the positive psychology concepts of growth mindset, grit, character strengths, happiness, and hope, we will empower students to be reflective, critical thinkers. Using children's literature, students will have a common language to explore these ideas. Participants will explore and design STEAM activities that connect to the concepts of the literature and foster a growth mindset. These activities will challenge students, impact their thinking, and promote a positive classroom culture where it's okay to "fail well."

Course Objectives:

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Analyze the role of growth mindset, grit, character strengths, happiness, and hope in fostering success within STEAM learning environments
- **Evaluate** children's literature as a tool for introducing and reinforcing positive psychology concepts in the classroom
- **Design** STEAM activities that intentionally integrate positive psychology principles to promote resilience, creativity, and critical thinking
- Implement instructional strategies that encourage students to "fail well" and view challenges as opportunities for learning and growth
- **Develop** a common language rooted in children's literature and positive psychology to build a supportive and reflective classroom culture
- Reflect on their own teaching practices to identify ways to strengthen student engagement, perseverance, and problem-solving skills through STEAM

- Be sensitive to the fact that there will be cultural and linguistic backgrounds, as well as different political and religious beliefs, plus just differences in general.
- Use good taste when composing your responses in Discussion Forums. Swearing and profanity is also part of being sensitive to your classmates and should be avoided.
 Also, consider that slang can be misunderstood or misinterpreted.
- Don't use all capital letters when composing your responses as this is considered "shouting" on the Internet and is regarded as impolite or aggressive. It can also be stressful on the eye when trying to read your message.
- Be respectful of others' views and opinions. Avoid "flaming" (publicly attacking or insulting) them as this can cause hurt feelings and decrease the chances of getting all different types of points of view.
- Be careful when using acronyms. If you use an acronym it is best to spell out its meaning first, then put the acronym in parentheses afterward, for example: Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs). After that, you can use the acronym freely throughout your message.
- Use good grammar and spelling.
