Course Title: Transform Your Classroom: Positive Behavior Strategies for Joyful Learning (3 credits)

Course Description:

This course equips elementary educators—both seasoned and new—with practical strategies and tools to implement effective positive behavior management systems that foster a joyful, safe, and inclusive classroom environment. For new teachers, this course provides foundational knowledge and tools to establish a well-managed classroom from the start. For seasoned teachers, it offers opportunities to reflect on and enhance current practices while exploring new strategies for addressing the changing needs of today's students. Teachers will develop or strengthen the skills needed to create inclusive, well-managed classrooms by setting clear expectations, using positive reinforcement, fostering a strong classroom community, establishing effective routines, addressing challenging behaviors constructively, and nurturing students' intrinsic motivation and social-emotional growth. By the end of the course, all participants will create a customized positive behavior management plan that will both support a more engaging and well-structured learning environment and be ready for immediate application in the classroom.
